VIDA NUEVA A Sober Living Environment Residential Program for Men



Vida Nueva SLE is a San Jose GI Forum Community Service Project

Vida Nueva accepts men of all races who can live amicably with others. We have Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) approved beds and bathrooms to serve the physically impaired.

We recently formed an alliance with the City of San Jose and the Veteran's Administration where we are now serving homeless veterans.

Residents are referred to Vida Nueva by "Destination Home", HUD, Veterans Affairs Supportive Housing (VASH), ex-residents, their families, their co-workers, employers, churches, unions, social service organizations, doctors and friends. Sometimes a person who is stressed out by the pervasiveness of drugs in his home and neighborhood comes to Vida Nueva on their own, seeking to make a positive change in their life.

We render reports to agencies and other entities, as requested, when their referrals are terminated or successfully complete the program. A certificate of enrollment/participation is granted to each resident and forwarded to the appropriate agencies.

VIDA NUEVA offers a pleasant home atmosphere in a clean and sober 10 room living environment. Our mission is to provide a clean and sober environment for those persons wishing to abstain from alcohol and other drugs. Vida Nueva is a program for men 18 years of age or older who have had at least 72 hours of abstinence and agree to abide by house rules. Staff is bilingual and bicultural and we support and encourage everyone to join us on the road back to recovery. The onsite Program Managers oversee operations and 24 hour surveillance.

Vida Nueva's philosophy is to provide services for the alcohol/substance abusing population. The program is based on the realization that the disease is highly destructive to both individuals and family. The program encourages the participant to attend Alcoholics Anonymous (A.A)., Narcotics Anonymous (N.A), and Codependents Anonymous (CA) meetings and to secure a sponsor. Residents also have weekly meetings (once a week) to discuss current issues and other urgent matters.

A large segment of the population are not sufficiently aware of the physical and social dangers of excessive drinking and drug abuse. It is these problems that the Vida Nueva program endeavors to alleviate through its sober living environment program. The Vida Nueva program rules are the same for everyone.

Residents are given the opportunity of taking responsibility for their own recovery. Urinalysis testing and progress reports will be made available to all referring agencies, i.e., court, probation, parole, etc. .

VTA transit bus stops for routes 22, 26, 70, and 77 are a few steps from our front door. We are situated about two blocks from the Eastridge transit hub.

Vida Nueva tests residents who are suspected of being under the influence, or as stipulated by referring judicial agencies. A pleasant home environment is a Vida Nueva hallmark. Our home faces the Eastridge Shopping Center and is convenient to public transportation and freeways 101 and 680.
